



MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

EDUCATION, RESEARCH, AND COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAMS

On this day, Wednesday, the two of April in the year two thousand and twenty-five, the undersigned:

- I. **Dr. Yudi Antomi, M.Si.** : Director of the Vocational School at Universitas Negeri Padang, overseeing the Study Program of Information, Library, and Archives, located at the Vocational School Building, UNP Campus, Jalan Prof. Dr. Hamka, Air Tawar Barat, Padang, West Sumatra, Indonesia. Hereinafter referred to as the **FIRST PARTY**.
- II. **Hafiz Latiff** : CEO of Penerbitan Kuras Buku, located in 18-1, Jalan Puteri 3A/5, Bandar Puteri Bangi, Kajang, Selangor Darul Ehsan, Malaysia, acting for and on behalf of Kuras Buku Publishing. Hereinafter referred to as the **SECOND PARTY**.

FIRST PARTY and **SECOND PARTY** hereinafter collectively referred to as **PARTIES** and individually referred to as **PARTY**.

THE PARTIES first explain the following matters.

1. The **FIRST PARTY** is a higher education institution implementing the Tri Dharma of Higher Education.
2. The **SECOND PARTY** is a publishing company engaged in book publishing and consulting.

Based on the aforementioned considerations and pursuant to their respective duties and authorities, the PARTIES hereby agree to implement a Cooperation Agreement under the following provisions:

Article 1
PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

- (1) This Cooperation Agreement serves as a mutual commitment between Kuras Buku Publishing Malaysia and Universitas Negeri Padang regarding education, research, and community service programs.
- (2) The objective is to strengthen institutional relations in conducting educational, research, and community service activities in the fields of information and publishing.

Article 2
OBJECT

The object of this agreement is the implementation of education, research, and community service programs.

Article 3
SCOPE

The cooperation programs shall include:

- a. Human resource development through formal and non-formal education and internships;
- b. Conducting research in the field of publishing;
- c. Conducting community service activities in the field of publishing

Article 4
IMPLEMENTATION

- (1) Human resource development cooperation through:
 - a. Curriculum-based teaching in the Information, Library, and Archives Study Program;
 - b. Training/seminars/workshops;
 - c. Internship programs.
- (2) Research cooperation through joint research in the field of publishing.
- (3) Community service cooperation through joint public service activities in the field of publishing

Article 5

RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

- (1) Rights of the FIRST PARTY:
 - a. Receive internship facilitation for students;
 - b. Receive supervisory assistance for student internship guidance and assessment;
 - c. Receive facilities as outlined in the agreed scope of cooperation.
- (2) Obligations of the FIRST PARTY:
 - a. Provide and assign human resources for educational and internship activities;
 - b. Conduct research in publishing;
 - c. Conduct community service in publishing;
 - d. Allocate funds for research and public service activities in publishing.
- (3) Rights of the SECOND PARTY:
 - a. Receive updated information on publishing developments;
 - b. Receive research outcomes in publishing;
 - c. Receive results of community service activities in publishing.
- (4) Obligations of the SECOND PARTY:
 - a. Facilitate student internship programs;
 - b. Provide supervisors for student internship guidance and assessment;
 - c. Provide speakers for training/seminar/workshop activities;
 - d. Provide necessary facilities as outlined in the agreed scope of cooperation;
 - e. Participate in literacy and publishing-related research;
 - f. Participate in community service activities in literacy and publishing.

Article 6

FUNDING

Funding for the implementation of this Cooperation Agreement shall be charged to the budget of the PARTIES and other legitimate and non-binding sources of funds in accordance with statutory provisions.

Article 7

DURATION

- (1) This agreement is valid for a period of five (5) years from the date of signing and may be extended or terminated by mutual consent of the PARTIES
- (2) Any PARTY wishing to extend the agreement must notify the other PARTY in

writing at least two (2) months before the expiration of the agreement

Article 8

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- (1) Disputes shall be resolved amicably through deliberation and consensus.
- (2) If consensus cannot be reached, disputes shall be resolved according to applicable legal regulations.

Article 9

FORCE MAJEURE

- (1) Force Majeure refers to any unforeseen events beyond the control of either PARTY, such as natural disasters, strikes, demonstrations, riots, sabotage, social unrest, or governmental policies, which hinder fulfillment of the agreement.
- (2) In such events, PARTIES shall be exempt from responsibility for delays or failures to perform their obligations.
- (3) The affected PARTY must notify the other in writing, accompanied by an official statement from an authorized agency, within 14 working days of the event.
- (4) Failure to notify shall make the affected PARTY liable for resulting losses and consequences.
- (5) If the unaffected PARTY does not respond in writing within 14 working days after notification, temporary suspension or delay shall be deemed approved.

Article 10

TERMINATION

This agreement shall terminate when:

- a. The agreement term expires;
- b. The objectives have been achieved;
- c. Both PARTIES agree to terminate;
- d. Legal or policy changes render the agreement unenforceable;
- e. The subject of cooperation is no longer available or has been destroyed

Article 11

MONITORING AND EVALUATION

- (1) Monitoring and evaluation shall be conducted jointly and continuously at least once every semester.
- (2) Findings shall inform improvements and reinforcements of this agreement.

Article 12

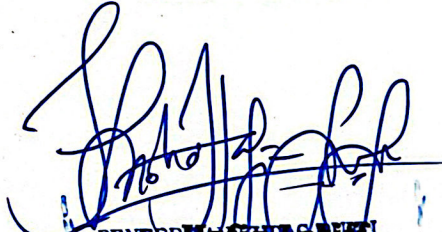
(2) Any change of address shall be communicated in writing and does not require an amendment to this agreement.
